Anaphylaxis Alert!!!

We have students at the school who have serious allergic reactions to bee stings, peanut and nut products and in one classroom, milk. While declaring ourselves a "peanut free" school is not possible, we can certainly be a "peanut aware" school. It is therefore very important that:

- 1) Instruct your child not to accept food from other children especially if you know that your child has food allergies.
- 2) That you avoid sending in food products that contain peanuts/peanut products and that you refrain from using peanut products if baking for a school function.
- 3) Discuss with your child the potential seriousness of these conditions and help us to provide the safest possible environment for all of our students.
- 4) In our classroom where there is a milk allergy, students are asked to consume milk alternatives for beverages.

Ensuring a Safe and Secure School

As you can appreciate, the arrival of children at school each day is a very busy time! The children are excited to see their friends. Teachers are busy getting the children settled and ready to learn. The end of school is also a little hectic, as students gather their homework and belongings before leaving. The Safety of all children attending our school is of the utmost importance. We would ask that all visitors/volunteers first report to the office when coming in to the school to check in. We can communicate with the classroom to have your child come to the office, or provide you with a 'volunteer' pass so that staff are aware you have been cleared by the office staff.

Our school encourages independence and responsibility for all students.

Students need the opportunity to develop a level of independence and responsibility appropriate to their age level. Independence and responsibility are two critical components of learning. They need to have opportunities to:

- •walk independently into the classroom
- •play with peers while waiting for the bell to ring
- •take off and hang up their coats, boots, hats, etc
- •be responsible for dressing themselves
- •take material out of their school bags
- •be responsible for carry items to and from school (snacks, lunch, books, newsletters, money for pizza, trips, etc.)

Talking with your child's teacher is important

Teachers are always happy to talk with you. When you wish to talk with your child's teacher, please call or make an appointment. The best times to contact teachers are before school, after school and during our Nutrition/Fitness Breaks.

When the bell rings, teachers have a responsibility to focus their attention on the children. This is not a time for parents. Even a "brief" talk with a parent interferes with this responsibility. If there is something that cannot wait, please send a note with your child or visit the office. We will ensure that the teacher receives your message or request.

We therefore ask parents not to enter the school when dropping off their children unless you are arriving late to school and need to go to the office to sign in your child. Please say your "Good-byes" outside the building and encourage your children to develop independent school entry. If arriving prior to the end of the school day, please wait for the bell to sound, and your child to exit through their assigned exit. If you need to pick up you child early for an appointment, kindly write a note in their agenda in the morning. The office will be more than happy to call your child to the office so that they can be signed out. We are unable to ensure that telephones will be answered in the afternoon to send a message regarding early pickup.

PARKING WITH CARE— Please enter our driveway with extreme caution and SLOW speed. We have 80—3, 4 and 5 year olds waiting for pick up at the end of the day and want to ensure they are safe. If able, please arrange for your older children to walk to and from school or to meet them down the street at the corner. This will reduce the parking stress in the lot. THANK YOU.


Grade 8 Students and Parents: Save the Date!

At the Stop Be 5 to 10 minutes early, and stand on the inside of the sidewalk/ shoulder

away from the roadway.

When the Bus Arrives Line up in a straight line, wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the

doors to open, and never touch the outside of the bus.

Getting on the Bus Get on the bus one at a time, hold the handrail as you climb the stairs, and go

directly to your seat and get settled.

Riding on the Bus Sit with your back to back of the seat and your bottom to the bottom of your

seat with your school bag on your lap, and use your quiet speaking voice so

that the bus driver can concentrate on driving.

Getting off the Bus Stay in your seat until the bus comes to a complete stop, only get off the bus at

your school or at your bus stop, look for your parent/ guardian before you get off the bus if that is your routine, and always tell the bus driver if you do not see your parent/ guardian at the bus stop waiting for you if that is your routine or if

you missed the stop.

Crossing in Front of the Bus Watch and wait for the bus driver to signal to you to cross the road once it is

safe to do so.

Once again we are asking that each child bring in a personal set of earphones for use on our computers. For hygienic reasons, it is important that each child have their own set. Earphones will be labeled and stored in each classroom and taken to computer lab for lessons.

Free Dental Screening Coming to Your School

A Public Health registered dental hygienist is scheduled to visit your school Mon. & Tues., Nov. 26 & 27, 2018 to provide dental screening to students in ELKP, grades 2, 4, 6, 7 and 8 as required under the Health Protection and Promotion Act.

During this time the registered dental hygienist will perform a quick visual inspection of each child's teeth to determine his/her dental needs. Parents will be contacted if their child requires immediate dental care. The Healthy Smiles Ontario program may financially assist children who do not have access to required dental care.

Please contact the Public Health dental program if:

You wish to exclude your child from dental screening

Your child is not in one of the targeted grades and you would like him/her to participate

In addition to dental screening, ELKP students have an opportunity to receive an optional free fluoride varnish application if they have returned a signed consent form.
